## **TAMPA BAY AREA REFUGEE TASK FORCE MINUTES**

***Mission Statement: Helping Refugees to settle, integrate and thrive through support, education and community.***

The meeting was held at the Department of Children and Families located at 9393 North Florida Ave, Tampa, FL. Janet Blair represented the Department of Children and Families (DCF), Refugee Service Program. A total of 54 individuals were present and the meeting was called to order at 1:35pm.

- Janet Blair opened the meeting with a welcome and introductions were given around the room.
- The Mental Health Minute was given by Stacy Kratz, Ph.D. The topic for this meeting was resiliency.
- Recognition was given to the Refugee & Migrant Women's Initiative which won the Organization of the Year award from the Tampa Bay Chapter of the National Association of Social Workers. Florence Ackey, who founded the organization, will receive the award at an event in March. More information will be sent to task force members on the event.

### **Presentations/Discussion:**

- Darnell Greene gave a presentation on the 2020 Census. The presenter explained the importance of educating refugee clients on the census so that their families can be counted. He explained that there are both political and economic implications of the Census count. Each state's congressional representatives are allocated based on the census. He also explained that the census impacts funding for schools, Head Start, and other government-funded programs. Currently, the Census is available in 14 languages. Mr. Greene said they are recruiting bilingual staff for part-time and full-time positions. - Janet Blair gave the Refugee Services update. Arrival numbers for federal fiscal year 2019 were shared and a timeline of task force events and projects for 2020 were outlined.
- Then the task force broke into small groups to discuss a variety of topics including planning World Refugee Day and the referral process for the new USF medical clinic being launched next month. Ideas and input were collected by a facilitator at each table. Sign-up sheets were also available for each task force committee/team. Notes on each topic will be typed up and shared at upcoming committee/team meetings. Committee/Team meetings will be held in the next month to follow up on these discussions. Teams/Committees will convene on Mental Health, Education, World Refugee Day planning and Community Outreach & Education.
