Attorney Questions for Early Education Portion of JRs

- 1. Is the child between zero and five years old?
- 2. If so, do they attend day care full-time, part-time or not at all?
 - a. If part-time: Is there a court order permitting part-time attendance?
 - b. *If not at all*: Why not? What social and educational opportunities do they have?[END QUESTIONING]
- 3. Did you obtain an attendance record from the child care provider?
 - a. If full-time: Does the child attend five days a week?
 - b. If part-time: Does the child attend in accordance with the court order?
- 4. Is the child care provider part of Quality Counts for Kids, Gold Seal Accreditation, or Head Start?
 - a. If not, have you:
 - i. Submitted an inquiry to the Early Learning Coalition to confirm quality?
 - 1. If so: What did they say?
 - ii. Checked the licensing website for that provider's licensing history?
 - 1. If so: What did you find?
 - iii. Provided the caregiver information on how to find a quality child care?
- 5. How many child care placements has the child had since coming into care?
 - a. If multiple placements:
 - i. Why?
 - ii. Was it possible to keep the child in the same child care?
- 6. When was the child's latest developmental screen?
- 7. What did it show?
- 8. What is being done to address any concerns in the developmental screen?
- 9. Did the child receive a CBHA?
 - a. If so: What were the recommendations? Have all recommendations been addressed?
 - b. *If not*: Why not?

- 10. Is the child receiving any other services that were not already mentioned?
- 11. Have you spoken with the child care provider recently?
- 12. Did they have any concerns for the child?
- 13. Can the biological parent(s) safely participate in their child's early education?
