How-to Guide

- When do I use this form? This form is for JRSSRs involving a child 0 to 5 years old who is not yet in school. Complete one for each child in your case that matches that description.
- How do I complete the form?
 - a. Answer each question on the form.

Question tips:

- i. Determining if a provider participates in Gold Seal or Head Start:
 - 1. Use the DCF CARES website:

https://cares.myflfamilies.com/PublicSearch/

- a. Search by the zip code of the provider.
- b. Select the provider from the resulting list.
- c. Look to see whether under the "Programs" field, the provider has an image representing participation in:
 - i. Gold Seal



OR

ii. Head Start



- ii. Determining if a provider participates in Quality Counts for Kids:
 - Review the Early Learning Coalition monthly report distributed to the Program Directors by Eckerd's Fostering Education Initiative. Note the Quality Counts for Kids providers are listed by zip code.

OR

- Ask Karen Perkins of the Early Learning Coalition if the provider participates in Quality Counts for Kids by emailing: kperkins@elchc.org.
- iii. Submitting an inquiry to the Early Learning Coalition regarding quality of a program:
 - 1. Email Karen Perkins (kperkins@elchc.org) with the following:
 - I am a case manager with the child welfare system and am trying to determine the quality of the following child care provider: INSERT NAME AND ZIP CODE OF DAY CARE.

- iv. Reviewing the provider's licensing history:
 - Go to the DCF Cares website:
 - https://cares.myflfamilies.com/PublicSearch
 - 2. Search by the provider's zip code (this is the easiest way to search the site). Note: it is a statewide website and so can be used to look up information for any child care around the state.
 - 3. Find your provider from the resultant list and click on the name.
 - 4. To find out whether the provider had a licensing violation, click on the PDF reports linked in the "Inspection Reports" section.
 - 5. Class One Violations include violations that pose an "imminent threat to a child including abuse or neglect and which could or does result in the death or serious harm to the health, safety or well-being of a child".
 - *In addition to looking out for serious, Class One Violations, also be aware of whether there's a pattern of violations.*
- v. Providing information to caregivers on quality child care:
 - 1. Tell caregivers to call Child Care Resource and Referral at 813-906-5041 or complete an online request at
 - https://www.elchc.org/programs services/child-care-resource-referral/ Advise the caregivers to request a list of Gold Seal Accredited, Quality Counts for Kids, and Early Head Start/Head Start providers in their zip code. Advise the caregivers to put in their phone or online request that they are asking on behalf of a child in the child welfare system and that they need the list of providers as quickly as possible.
 - 2. Remind the caregivers to review the licensing history of their chosen provider on the DCF Cares website:
 - https://cares.myflfamilies.com/PublicSearch
 - 3. Suggest to caregivers that they should explore the Ages 0 to 5 resources on the following site:
 - http://centerforchildwelfare.fmhi.usf.edu/Circuit13.shtml
- b. Obtain from the child care provider and attach the following:
 - i. Attendance Record
 - ii. Child's Latest Developmental Screen
- c. Obtain and attach any of the following that are applicable:
 - i. Individualized Education Plan
 - ii. Individualized Family Support Plan (will have if participating in Early Steps)
 - iii. Updates from any providers serving the child
- What do I do with this form when it is completed? Send the completed form and all appropriate attachments to the Attorney General's office.
