The individual providers would use whatever tool is required by the other programs they may participate in, like School Readiness or Head Start. | BOCC Head Start providers use the Brigance developmental screener. | HCPS Head Start providers use the Brigance developmental screener. | Eckerd Early Head Start screens development using the Brigance and/or Ages and Stages Questionnaire. They also use the Devereux Early Childhood Assessment to screen social-emotional development. |
