Child Protective Investigation Notifications to the Agency for Persons with

Disabilities (APD) and Agency for Health Care Administration (AHCA)

PURPOSE: The purpose of this memorandum is to reinforce the notification policy required when a child protective investigator (CPI) investigates a case involving a child in a facility or home licensed by APD or AHCA.

BACKGROUND: The standard for timely notification to APD and AHCA is defined in s. 39.302(1), Florida Statutes (F.S.), which directs child protective investigators to notify the appropriate licensing agency upon receipt of a report alleging any individual acting in an official capacity that has abused, neglected, or abandoned a child.

Section 39.302(2), F.S., authorizes the Department to restrict the subject's access to children in the facility up to 90 days pending the outcome of an investigation when there is some evidence that child abuse, abandonment, or neglect has occurred and there is threatened harm to the physical health, mental health, or welfare of the children.

ACTION REQUIRED: To operationalize the notification process, child protective investigators shall notify AHCA at CAU@ahca.myflorida.com and APD using the regionally-based email mailbox (see regional contact list attachment) to meet the statutory mandate for timely notification, using the process outlined below.

<u>REMINDER</u>: Any email containing client identifying information <u>must</u> be encrypted. To encrypt an email coming from DCF Outlook, the word "Encrypt" must be the first word in the subject line (i.e., Encrypt DCF Report Notice).

 Upon receipt of a report alleging abuse, neglect or abandonment on any child in an APD or AHCA licensed facility or home, the CPI will provide the following information in a written email notification:

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- 2. If the initial report does not identify the alleged child's name or caretaker's name, upon determination of the above the CPI must submit the email notification with the same information identified in number 1 above, no later than the next business day.
- 3. At closure of the investigation, the CPI will submit an email notification providing the following information:

The CPI is responsible for determining if the subject's access should be restricted from having contact with children at the licensed facility, per s. 39.302(2), F.S. The CPI shall notify APD or AHCA immediately when enforcing the restriction, as well as when the restriction is lifted.

The CPI shall ensure all institutional cases receive an institutional staffing. An initial staffing shall occur within the first two weeks of receipt of the investigation. All parties with pertinent information, to include the licensing authority (APD or AHCA), shall be notified. If an investigation closure decision is not known at the time of the staffing, a follow-up staffing shall occur to include the same parties involved. CPI staff will notify the parties of the investigation outcome and how the investigation maltreatment(s) will be founded and closed.
