PURPOSE: The purpose of this memo is to announce the approval of enhancements to the Florida Safe Families Network (FSFN) on March 24, 2017. The FSFN system will be unavailable Friday, March 24, from 10:00 p.m. until midnight to implement the production build. BACKGROUND: In preparation for the March 24, 2017, deployment of the new FSFN functionality, there was a continuous effort to assess and achieve people readiness, system readiness and the implementation of a support plan. On March 21, 2017, the Department and partners reached a final "ready" state for all three categories, and the release was approved for go-live.

PEOPLE READINESS: Ready! All Regions report that staff, Sheriff's Offices and community-based care lead agencies (CBCs) are ready.

SYSTEM READINESS: Ready! FSFN User Acceptance Testing was completed. and the build implementation plan has been approved.

POST-DEPLOYMENT SUPPORT READINESS: Ready! Post-deployment support will include daily calls for the two weeks following deployment to evaluate and respond to any issues. The support team will include members from the Office of Child Welfare Policy and Practice team, Office of Information Technology Services team, IBM team, Regional Points of Contact, and CBC Points of Contact. - As a reminder, FSFN has not been certified to operate on Microsoft Office 2016. With the new templates being introduced, if users encounter an issue, they need to be prepared to provide the version of Word they are using when reporting the issue to the Help Desk.
