

Background Screening Requirements for Child-Caring Agency Employees

Required criminal history and other records checks for child-caring agency employees are outlined in s. 39.0138, Florida Statutes, s. 409.175, F.S., s. 435.04, F.S and 65C-46.011 Florida Administrative Code.

Effective 2018, all background screening requirements that are valid for 12 months were due for a rescreen 60-90 days prior to re-licensure. **As of November 1, 2021**, providers will screen their staff prior to the expiration of the most recent 12-month screening date. Providers must ensure that 5-year screens are completed prior to the expiration date.
