



Florida's Youth Survey: Spring 2017

Who Completed the Survey?

1039 Youth ages 13-17 completed the Spring 2017 "My Services" survey.

Youth who completed the survey live in a *licensed* foster care placement.

How is the survey administered?

"My Services" survey, is an on-line self-report survey designed to be completed in modules to better accommodate a youth's schedule during the time the survey is open.

The self-report youth survey is part of the Department's "*Listening to Every Youth...Every Year...*" project.

For Spring 2017, the survey was open from April 15th – June 17th.

Is the survey confidential?

Survey answers are private. Cby25[®] does not share individual survey responses with anyone. Only the Department has access to the youth's identifier and survey response information.

Survey Data Reports

CBC Lead Agencies and their providers can access aggregate youth survey response data by age group and survey period. CBC Lead Agencies and their providers *cannot* access individual youth responses.

Access to the survey data provides CBC Lead Agencies with information that can be used to help identify foster care services that are working well and areas where services can be improved.

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Updating the Survey

Beginning in August of 2016 the Office of Child Welfare (OCW) began a comprehensive review of the administration of the “My Services” Survey. The goal is to move toward a more user-friendly survey, one that will not only appropriately capture the youth voice, but inform all licensed caregivers and Child Welfare Professionals on their practices strengths and needs.

In phase one, OCW eliminated some questions that were either no longer applicable or provided information that could be gathered utilizing another data source. In May of 2017, OCW facilitated a workgroup with pertinent stakeholders, gathering critical feedback and recommendations. Efforts are still underway to revamp survey administration and tools.

Bright Futures awards include: Florida Academic Scholars award (FAS), Florida Medallion Scholars award (FMS), Florida Gold Seal CAFE Scholars award (GSC) and the Florida Gold Seal Vocational Scholars award (GSV).

Tuition and Fee Exemption

Florida provides tuition and fee exemptions to eligible young adults. The waiver is authorized at State (public) Universities, Colleges (public) in the Florida College System, and School District Workforce Education Programs.

Fee exemptions are offered to students if:

- He or she is or was at the time he or she reached age 18 in the custody of the Department of Children and Families;
- He or she was adopted from the Department of Children and Families after May 5, 1997;
- He or she is or was at the time of reaching age 18 in the custody of a relative under s. 39.20(5), F.S. » » »;
- He or she is or was at the time of reaching age 18 in the custody of a non-relative under s. 39.20(8), F.S. » » » or;
- He or she was placed in a guardianship by the court after spending at least 6 months in the custody of the department after reaching 15 years of age.

***The exemption remains valid until the student reaches 25 years of age. See § 1009.25(1)(c) (d), Fla. Stat. §.

Am I ready to get a learner's permit and a driver's license?

It is important that the youth, caregiver, case manager and others involved with the youth have a discussion about the readiness of the youth and that it be included in the youth's transition plan. The youth and caregiver roles and responsibilities form included in the application packet is intended to provide a basis for this discussion and must be signed by both the youth and the caregiver. The youth and the caregiver should review the [DMV section for Teen Drivers](#).

Do I qualify for the Keys to Independence Program?

To qualify for reimbursement for the costs associated with learners permit and driver's license you must:

- Be in licensed foster care
- Be between 15-21 year old
- Meet the Department (DMV) requirements for application of a learner's intermediate or full privilege license
- Complete a comprehensive [driver's education course](#) if you are requesting reimbursement for the costs for expenses related to an intermediate or full driver's license.
- Have approval of your primary caregiver who will use the same standard that they would use for their own child - we call this the reasonable and prudent parent standard
