

SCHOOL-AGE CHILD CARE CREDENTIAL

Child Care Standards

65C-22.001(6), and 65C-20.008(6), Florida Administrative Code

A child care professional using a school-age child care credential to meet the staff credential requirement, must have one of the following:

Florida Department of Children and Families School-Age Credential Training Program (FCCPC)

The FCCPC School-Age is a departmentapproved training program that consists of a minimum of 120 hours of early childhood instruction and 480 contact hours with children in a school-age child care setting.

Florida Department of Education School-Age Professional Certificate (SAPC)

The Department of Education also has a school-age training program that, upon graduation can be used to meet the Staff Credential requirement.

- Q. How will my initial FCCPC or SAPC be reflected on my DCF Child Care Training Transcript?
 - **A.** Your training provider will submit the information to the Department when you have completed all of the program requirements.

The School-Age Child Care Credentials (FCCPC and SAPC) must be <u>renewed every five</u> <u>years</u>.
